



### **\*\*Introduction:\*\***

Alice and Cindy introduced themselves and provided an overview of their roles and responsibilities.

### **\*\*Recap of Last Meeting (Q1):\*\***

- Implemented new signage around the club emphasizing consent.
  - Established a mediation procedure with a safe, immediate reporting system.
  - Standardized Dungeon Monitor (DM) training, consisting of three 25-minute videos, written materials, and a quiz covering de-escalation procedures and first aid.
  - Finalizing the volunteer contract outlining behavioral expectations.
- Initiated biannual celebrations focused on mental health, substance use, and consent awareness.
- Nina has identified 35 clubs to discuss disciplinary actions and organizational structures, noting varied transparency levels.
- Only two clubs have publicly accessible information on these topics.
  - 10% of clubs operate on a BYOB basis.
- Mac has been appointed as the lead for the mediation process.
  - The mediation process has handled 18 unique cases with 7 active mediators since its inception.

### **\*\*Mediation Process:\*\***

- Reports can be filed via a form or QR code.
- Each case is assigned two mediators who schedule a meeting with the reporter.
- A panel of mediators devises resolutions for all parties involved, aiming to address cases within 7 days.

### **\*\*Process Updates:\*\***

- Discussion on enabling computer-based reporting.



**\*\*Discussion Points:\*\***

- Comparison with other clubs, which often store IDs. After careful consideration, we have decided not to store IDs due to the potential risks it poses to our patrons' privacy and safety.
- Proposal to facilitate scene engagement preferences using signs at the bar, Velcro patches, or traffic cones.
- Suggestion for a "do not interact unless previously discussed" policy.
- Implementation of a 15-minute consent orientation and dungeon etiquette briefing on first Fridays, potentially mandatory for newcomers.
  - Proposal for a dedicated tour guide on first Fridays and designated DMs to manage scene traffic.
- Discussion on handling disruptions, common in Chicago scenes.
- Consideration of a fixed door locking time to enhance safety.
  - Debate on introducing a polycule membership, with a preliminary decision against it.

**\*\*Privacy and Safety Measures:\*\***

- Disclosure of a confidential watch list, accessible only to moderators and Dungeon Monitors (DMs). This list includes individuals flagged by staff as potentially disruptive or at risk, though no formal action has been taken. The watch list will not be disclosed to the public to ensure privacy.

**\*\*Town Hall Process:\*\***

- Scheduled ongoing town halls to last 2 hours, with the next session planned for 4 months from now. (September 14)

**\*\*Open Questions:\*\***

- Feasibility of computer-based reporting.
- Potential for mandatory consent classes and quizzes at the door to enhance rule familiarity and compliance.
- Optimal strategies for managing first-time attendees and ensuring non-interference
